Discussion followed concerning the barricading of the alley from fire house to W. Franklin. Mr. Jos. Williams, attorney, clarified the question, Who owns the alley? He stated that under the circumstances he believe the alley is owned by the Village. After listening to Dr. Black's explanation why the alley should be closed, Mr. Williams stated that the Village cannot take care of an alley unless it is dedicated and the only way it can be known is by the Court, unless the property owners recind their former action and dedicate the property in the alley to the Village.

After discussion, Mr. Anthony moved that the Council will pass an Ordinance to erect STOP signs at entrance of West Franklin to Fire House and "STOP signs at N.W. corner of the Busse Business Building. The Council makes immediate demands upon Dr. Black, Mrs. Spizak, Mrs. Woolpert, Hugh Busse and other property owners to remove barricade from the alley and failing the removal of the same within 2 days, the Mayor is further directed and authorized to institute proper proceedings in behalf of the Village of Centerville to require removal of the same, seconded by Mr. Poff. Discussion followed which stated the Council will further study the problem and take further action if necessary to eliminate hazards as they appear. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 4 ayes in favor of the motion.
