Mr. Busse stated that he would like to have the Council pay for the paving of the alley from R.48 to Firehouse. After discussion Mr. Presbaugh made the motion that Mr. Busse be paid the amount as heretofore allocated and authorized by the Council to pave the alley and that Mr. Busse would accept the \$125. as payment of full claim, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

The Mayor presented a petition of Russell Elliott with signatures of Lucas Plat owners for rezoning of his property on So. Main. It was decided that a public hearing for the same Town Hall would be Sept. 28 8 P.M./and the Clerk was to place notices of the hearing so all interested persons could attend.

The Mayor mentioned the raising of the Mayor's Salary for 1954. Mr. Poff moved that this be done. There was no second.
