The Council with Mr. Vigus made a tour of the Village to study the lighting problem. After returning, Mr. Schell moved that the Village add 6- 4000 lumen lights at designated places decided Approx. *240. Approvide of for Same at Oct. 12 meeting and as marked on Village map, on file in Office, seconded by Mr. Tippy and carried. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion. The Clerk was authorized to write letter to the Dayton Power & Light confirming the motion.
