Holes in the East Ridgeway Street should be fixed immediately before greater damage to street or Cars is done. The street in front of properties of Mr. Ricking and Bromley have not been put back as they were before. It was suggested and agreed by the Council the clerk should notify them of their responsible in fixing the street <sup>it was</sup> as/before. It was moved by Mr. Schell, Seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried that the Street Committee is authorized to have the holes patched on East ridgeway. A roll call resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Killen's letter from the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs was read to the Council. Parts of the Written agreement as drafted by solicitor Lynn were read.
