

Thereupon, Mr. Schell introduced Ordinance 12-1953, "Being an Ordinance fixing the salary of the Village Marshall. Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio: Section I - That the salary of the duly appointed Marshal of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, shall be Three Thousand Eight Hundred dollars(\$3800.) per annum, payable in monthly instalments. Section II-That the duly appointed and qualified Marshal of the Village of Centerville shall furnish a fidelity bond for the sum of \$1000. given by a corporate surety acceptable by the Villgae Council. Section III- That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the first day of January, 1954. Section IV- That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed," Mr. Anthony made the following motion: "I

move that the statutory rule requiring Ordinances and Resolutions to be read on 3 separate and distinct days be dispensed with so Ord. 12-1953 may be given its second and third readings, seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried unanimously. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

Ord. 12-1953 was given its second and third readings.

The question being, Shall Ord. 12-1953 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Tippy and carried unanimously that Ord. 12-1953 be passed. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

Discussion followed concerning the numbering of streets. The opinion of the Council was to have a uniform or standard system. Information was to be received from the Centerville Planning Board, Municipal League and the Co. Planning Board.

A call meeting of Council was scheduled for Sat. 2:00P.M. <sup>Dec. 19</sup> to ~~xxxx~~ discuss bids received for New Cruiser. Also a call meeting for Mon. Dec. 28 to complete the business of 1953.

### Call Meeting

The Mayor related his conversation with Mr. Suro of the Montgomery Co. Planning Commission and stated that Mr. Suro would be willing to help but not in an official capacity. Mr. Lynn suggested it would profit the Village to have the technical advice of the Montgomery Planning Commission especially in writing new or amending zoning ordinances. After discussion, Mr. Schell moved that the Village of Centerville enter in <sup>written</sup> an agreement with the Montgomery County Planning Commission as heretofore mentioned by A.E. Suro, providing for the cooperative assistance of the Montgomery County Planning Commission to the Centerville Planning Board and further providing for a review of subdivision plats within the Corporate limits of Centerville by the Montgomery Co. Planning Commission, seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried unanimously.

A roll call was ordered which resulted in 4 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh that approximately \$1131. from the General Fund and \$716. from the St. Maint. Fund be used to ~~reduce~~ pay Cowden & Co. , seconded by Mr. Anthony. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 3 ayes and 1 nay. Mr. Lyons voting nay. The motion didnot pass.
