Mr. Lyons made the following recommendation
 to the Village Planning Board in behalf of the Village Council,
 "That Lyons Drive from Mr. Lyons property line to Sheldon
 Drive is included in Mr. Gorman's Bond but the new street
 specifications will be enforced on Sheldon Drive."
