E.J. Barney Gorman, Dear Sir: The undersigned is writing as Mayor of the Village of Centerville and in accordance with the direction of the Village Council. At its last meeting, the Council discussed the question of installation and dedication of streets by you on your land located within the Village. Please be advised that no building permits will be issued under the authority of the appropriate Village ordinances for construction of homes except where such structures abut on streets which have been properly dedicated and approved. Discussion followed concerning the alley from route 48 past the Baptist church to Maple Avenue; the Cemetery road maintenance to be continued by the Township Trustees and the terminal of East Drive which acts as a driveway to the Benner residence.
