After a brief discussion concerning the information contained in these documents, Mr. Randolph made a motion to destroy the records as presented. Mrs. McLaughlin seconded the motion.

Depending on the confidentiality of the documents being destroyed, it was agreed that destruction by burning, shreading or by placing the records directly in the back of a refuse packer are the only methods acceptable.

Mr. Kenning instructed Mr. Randolph to supervise the burning of the police records now ready for destruction.

Mr. Kenning requested that the Dispatcher Complaint Slips be added to the Schedule of Record Retention and Destruction for the Police Department.

Mr. Bettcher was instructed to prepare a memo to all department heads requesting that all records, which are now due for destruction, be destroyed by December 31, 1980.
