The Contractor shall obtain Workmen's Compensation coverage, Public Liability Insurance and Property Damage Insurance, for all claims which may arise in connection with this contract. All such insurance to remain in full force and effect throughout the term of the contract, and Contractor shall furnish Village with a certificate of such coverage. Such Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance shall be in the following amounts:

Public Liability Insurance in an amount not less than \$100,000.00 for injuries, including accidental death, to any one person, and, subject to the same limit for each person, in an amount not less than \$300,000.00, on account of one accident, and Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than \$10,000.00 for each accident, \$50,000.00 aggregate.

15. Bond by the Contractor. The Contractor shall furnish a bond satisfactory to the Village for faithful performance of the within contract in the sum of \$1,000.00. In the event of a breach of contract by the Contractor, said bond shall be forfeited as liquidated damages for failure of performance, it being recognized by the Contractor and the Village that the Village will sustain damages by such a breach which are not capable of being accurately ascertained.

16. Assignment. The Contractor will not be permitted to assign the proposed contract or any part thereof without first having obtained the written approval of the Village and the assignment of the proposed contract, or any part thereof, will not relieve the Contractor of any of his liabilities under the terms of the proposed contract.

Section 3. For the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
