The Meeting was opened by Mayor Heintz with welcoming comments.

Mr. David McDaniel, Centerville High School Principal, reviewed activities of a Committee formed to study the feasibility of an indoor swimming pool in the Centerville/Washington Township Community. He believes that the Community deserves an indoor facility. The Committee is currently waiting to assess the final results of the South Suburban YMCA.

Mr. Fink advised that the Township has been in negotiations with the YMCA. If acquisition occurs, it is the intent to construct an indoor pool, things look positive, information should be forthcoming later this month.

The three entities reviewed their tax levy projections. There will be a new tax levy placed on the ballot this fall by Washington Township.

Mr. Kenning and Mr. Morton reviewed current road projects in the City of Centerville and Washington Township; several major road projects are underway.

Mr. Miller announced the dedication of the new Township Administration Building to take place July 5, 1987. The old Town Hall will remain under the ownership of Washington Township and will be available for use by the K-O Players, Town Hall Players and various Civic Associations.

Major new developments in the City and Township were outlined by Mr. Kenning and Mr. Morton.

Mr. Buchanan reviewed legal activities in the Township during the past five years.

Mrs. Janice Mooreland, Director of Pupil Personnel for the Centerville Schools, reviewed pupil enrollment projections for 1988. Classes become slightly larger each year.

Discussion followed relative to school recognition signs. The three Administrators will seek a preliminary design to be considered by the three entities.

Dr. Overly outlined activities by Ohio State Legislators which will effect schools financially.
