SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE JOINT TRUSTEE-COUNCIL MEETING April 2, 1980
Sponsored by the Citizens for Co-operative and Responsive Government Committee

The Joint Washington Township Trustee-Centerville City Council Meeting was held April 2, 1980 in Council Chambers of the Centerville Municipal Building, 100 W. Spring Valley Road. CCRG member Dick Fish served as moderator. In attendence from Centerville Council was Leonard Stubbs, and from Township Trustees Russell Miller and Duane Snyder. From the CCRG Committee were Janet Holder, Dick Huss, Dean Brandt, Christine Snyder, Leo Bischoff, and Edna Achor. G. Collins from the Journal-Herald and Melanie McClurkin from the Times were present.

- 1. Three Mile Jurisdiction Working Agreement It was reported that the working agreement on the administration of the Three Mile Jurisdiction between City and Township staff persons was working well.
- 2. Joint Zoning Study Trustees reported that the Township Zoning Commission is still unwilling to proceed with the work program suggested by the Joint Zoning Study Committee. It was suggested that the zoning study sub-committee of the Community Government Task Force make possible recommendations.
- 3. It was reported that the Community Government Task Force that had been appointed by Trustees and Council and other community organizations had organized and was working well. Council and Trustees had consulted State Rep. Corbin and State Senator Curran on state laws concerning merger of local governments.
- 4. The poor attendence of Council members was noted, and a suggestion was made that perhaps a new direction for these joint meetings should be sought. Trustees and Council expressed willingness to continue meeting to discuss problems and new decisions to be made. It was suggested that Council and Trustees should meet together informally occasionally to keep each group informed of happenings and issues.
- 5. Trustees reported that at a recent meeting of I-675 corridor community representatives that five plans had been suggested for the use of the \$90million dollars made available by cancellation of the Interstate Route 675. Centerville and Washington Township agree that Route 725 should be widened from the city limits to Washington Church Road, and that all the funds should be used within the I-675 corridor.
- 6. Agenda for June 4 Meeting It was suggested by those officials present that they would like to meet with the Task Force to hear a progress report. It was agreed the Chairman Jeanne Eickman would be contacted to arrange this meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 P.M.
