## RESOLUTION NO. <u>59-2/</u> CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

A RESOLUTION REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 22-20, THE CITY'S DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE.

WHEREAS, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine had declared a state of emergency for the entire State to protect the well-being of the citizens of the Ohio from the dangerous effects of COVID-19 and to assist in protecting the lives, safety, and health of the citizens of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the original Executive Order the Governor had initiated other requirements regarding the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville adopted Resolution No. 22-20 on March 3, 2020, declaring a State of Emergency in the City of Centerville due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2021, the Governor determined that most pandemic health orders would be lifted on June 2, 2021; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to follow the Governor's lead and thereby lift the State of Emergency in the City.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

- <u>Section 1</u>. That the City Council of the City of Centerville hereby declares that based upon the Governor's lifting of Orders regarding the pandemic, effective June 2, 2021 or when the Governor lifts the State of Emergency, a state of emergency will no longer exist in the City of Centerville.
- Section 2. Consistent with the Governor's orders, City Council further hereby revokes and repeals Resolution No. 22-20 as of either June 2, 2021 or the date that the Governor lifts the health orders or the Ohio State of Emergency.
- Section 3. That this Resolution shall go into effect at the earliest time allowed by law, but said lifting of the State of Emergency shall be as set forth in this Resolution.
