Mrs. Rau made a motion for approval of the minutes, Mr. Lunsford seconded the motion, and it passed 7-0.

Officials' Reports

Mayor Compton spoke about the following items:

- Thanked staff and participants of the Community and Faith Leaders Breakfast.
- Announced that Tony Miltenberger is retiring from Restoration Church. He will remain active in the community and will provide the invocation at the upcoming Veterans Day Ceremony.

Mrs. Rau informed that the Miami Valley Communications Council, at its meeting on October 20, authorized the purchase of the hardware and software to provide live closed caption capabilities to each of the eight member communities.

Mrs. Rau spoke about the October 20 Centerville Community Improvement Corporation meeting on October 20 where loan criteria was discussed.

Mr. Engert announced the Centerville-Washington History Veterans Tribute will be on display at the Woodbourne Library from November 11-14.

Mr. Engert advised the Centerville-Washington History Holiday Walk is scheduled for November 21.

Mr. Engert provided an update of the various Centerville High School athletic teams' tournament status.

Mr. Lunsford advised that the Americana Committee will meet on November 17 at the Centerville Police Department.

Mrs. Kenley voiced support for the Human Services levy; it is a renewal and will not generate new taxes; it retains critical human services for the community.

Mr. Palcher requested Mayor Compton give an update on Arts Commission Chair Jim Collins. Mayor Compton informed that Mr. Collins is home and recovering from his recent surgery.

In the City Manager's Report, Mr. Davis spoke about:

- Initial October earning tax revenues appear to be up by 17 percent; earning tax is up 10 percent year-to-date.
- Lieutenant Mike Yoder will conduct a new leadership initiative called Leadership Circles. Twelve to fourteen staff members will participate.
- Wished good luck to all candidates and issues in tomorrow's election.

Consent Agenda

Mr. Serr requested clarification on the MKSK agreement amendment. Mr. Turnbull explained the amendment adjusts the project scope, but the project is still in the design phase. No project specifics have been finalized.

Mr. Engert requested elaboration on the debt collection delinquency numbers. Mr. Roark informed that \$21 million is collected annually. Approximately \$150-200 thousand is uncollected and administered as delinquency through the City's internal process which recoups approximately 60-70 percent of the debt.

Mr. Palcher sponsored the Consent Agenda and moved for its approval. Mrs. Kenley seconded the motion, and it passed with 7 ayes. **Adjournment**
