ORDINANCE NO. 14-23
CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER JoAnne Ray ON THE 10th DAY
OF October, 2023.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING, REAFFIRMING AND
RESTATING ORDINANCE 02-04 AND AUTHORIZING THE
CITY OF CENTERVILLE TO PICK UP THE STATUTORILY
REQUIRED CONTRIBUTION TO THE OHIO POLICE AND FIRE
PENSION FUND FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF
CENTERVILLE.

WHEREAS, the eligible employees of the Centerville Police Department participate
in the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund (“OP&F”); and

WHEREAS, the Centerville City Council has previously adopted a pick-up of all of
the ten percent (10%) mandatory contributions required to be paid under Section
742.31 of the Ohio Revised Code for participating employees of the Centerville Police
Department who are members of the OP&F; and

WHEREAS, the required pick-up percentage had increased since Ordinance 02-04 was
adopted to twelve and a quarter percent (12.25%) mandatory contributions; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Police & Fire Pension Fund has adopted new procedures for
reporting picked-up contributions in order to properly prepare 1099-R forms for its
members; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville Council wishes to reaffirm, amend, and/or restate
its prior Ordinance in order to continue the pick-up under the new procedures.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE
HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That effective as of July 15, 2013 through July 13, 2014, the Centerville
City Council had determined to continue to pick-up all of the ten and three quarters
percent (10.75%) mandatory contributions by the employees who are members of the
Ohio Police & Fire Pension Fund through a payroll reduction; and effective as of July
14, 2014 through July 12, 2015 the Centerville City Council had determined to
continue to pick-up all of the eleven and one half percent (11.50%) mandatory
contributions by the employees who are members of the Ohio Police & Fire Pension
Fund through a payroll reduction; and as of July 13, 2015 thereafter, the Centerville
City Council has determined to continue to pick-up all of the twelve and a quarter
percent (12.25%) mandatory contributions by the employees who are members of the
Ohio Police & Fire Pension Fund through a payroll reduction; and Ordinance 2-04 is
so amended.

Section 2. That said picked up contributions paid through a payroll reduction, even though designed as employee contributions for state law purposes are being paid by the City of Centerville in lieu of said contributions by the employee.

Section 3. That said picked up contributions will not be included in the gross income of the employees for tax reporting purposes, that, for federal or state income tax withholding taxes, until distributed from the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund.

Section 4. That said picked up contributions will be included in the gross income of the employees for employment tax purposes an the contributions are made to the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund.

Section 5. That said employees shall not be entitled to any option of choosing to receive the contributed amounts directly instead of having them paid by the City of Centerville to the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law.
