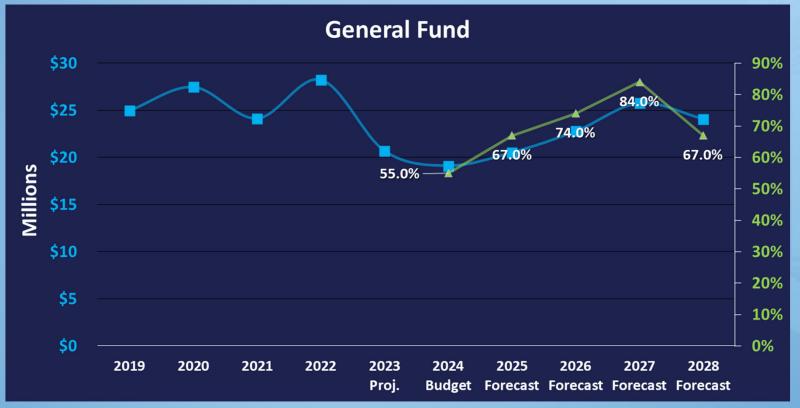

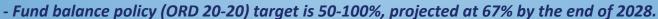
### ALL FUNDS ENDING BALANCE





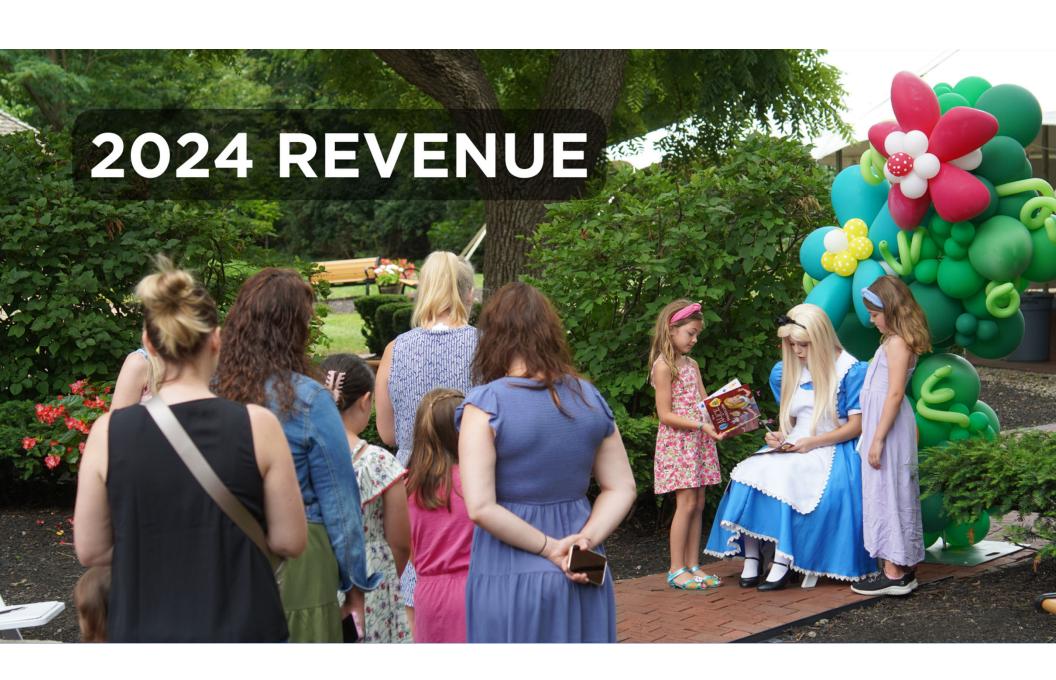
### **GENERAL FUND ENDING BALANCE**

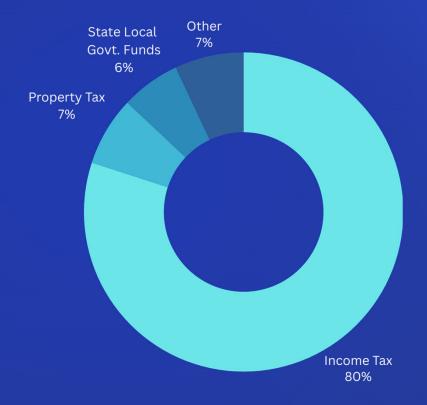

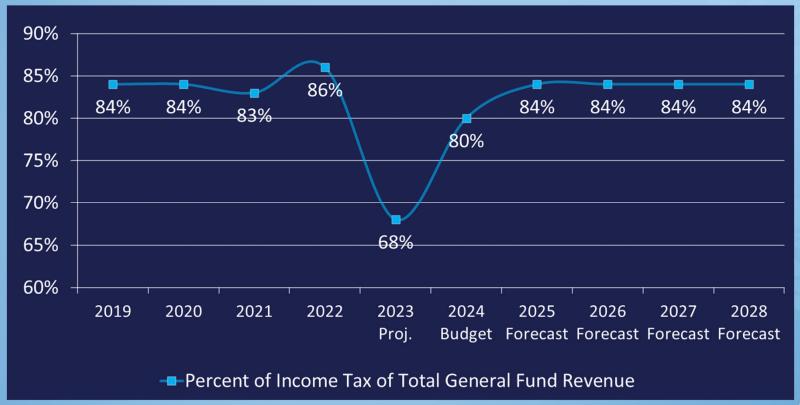

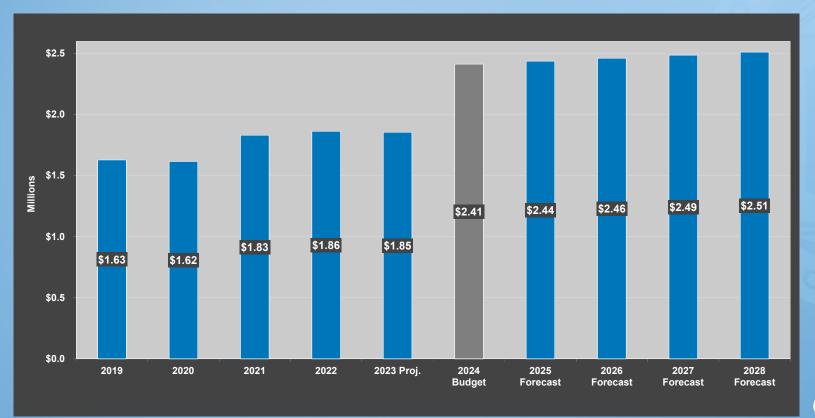
### STATE LEGISLATION- IMPACTING FINANCES

- HB 754 and SB 352- Repealed Section 29 of HB 197, which allowed municipalities to collect income tax from the jurisdiction where the employer is located rather than an employee's work-from-home location.
- HB 33 Ordinance 16-23 amended Chapter 885 of the Centerville Municipal Code. Amendments included correction to existing language, alternative apportionment for businesses with remote workers, net profit extension filings extended one month, notices prohibited while taxpayers on extension and late filing penalty change and waiver.
- HB 296 proposed 5-year phase-in to increase the current OP&F employer match from 19.5% to 24% by January 1, 2027.
- OPERS board recently approved a recommendation to the legislature for raising the maximum contribution rates for OPERS to 18% for employers (14% currently).
- HB93 proposed amendments regarding limitations on recovery and lien imposition by municipalities against property owners of non-owner-occupied properties for unpaid water, sewer, and disposal services rates and charges.

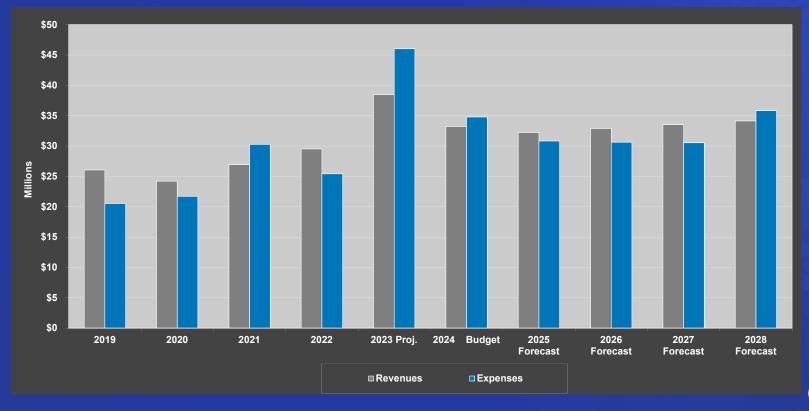
### PROPERTY TAX DOLLAR







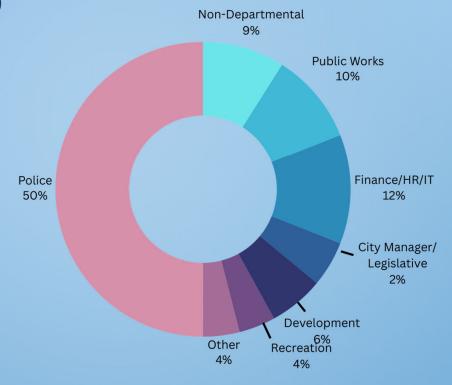

(EXCLUDES TRANSFERS)





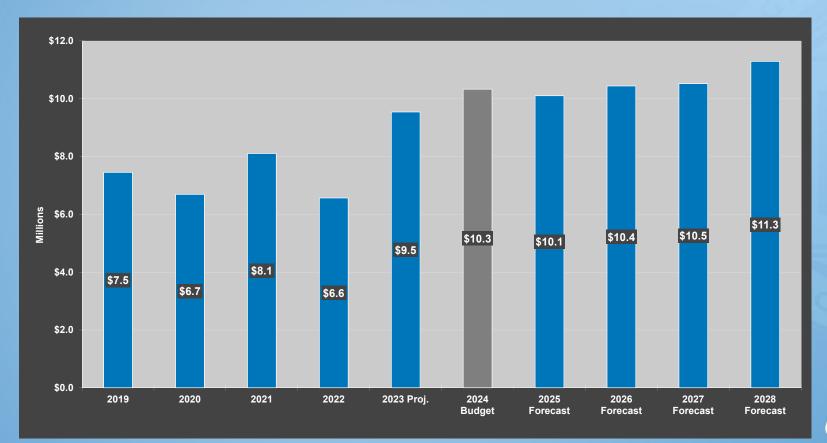

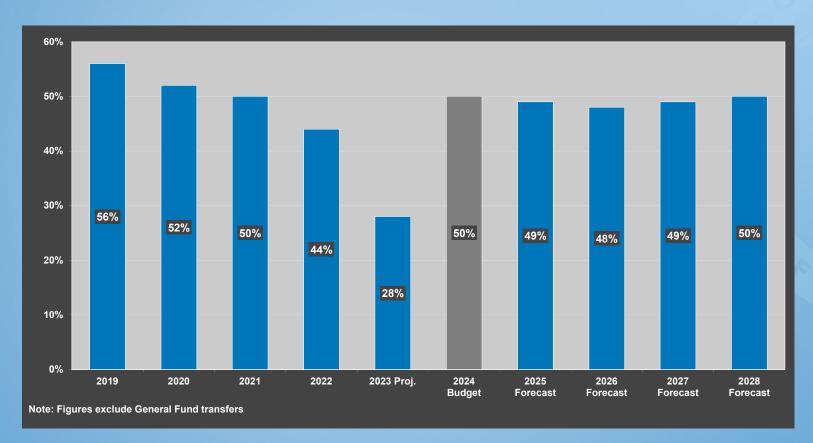


### **POLICE EXPENSES**





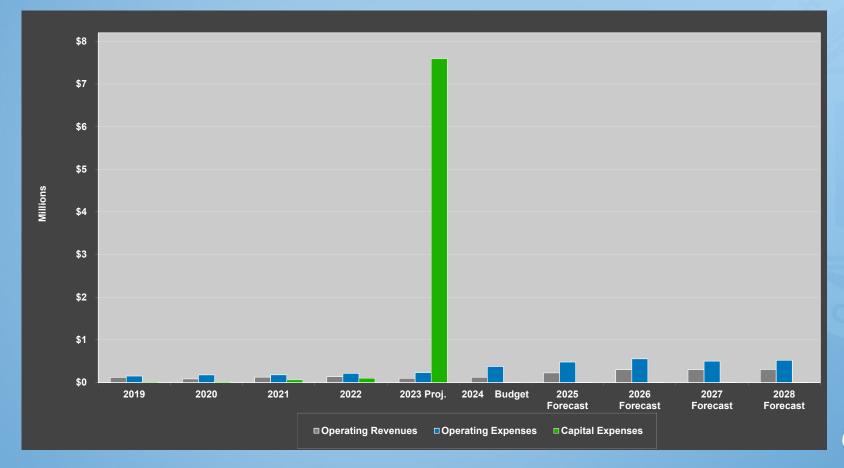
# POLICE EXPENSES AS A PERCENTAGE OF GENERAL FUND







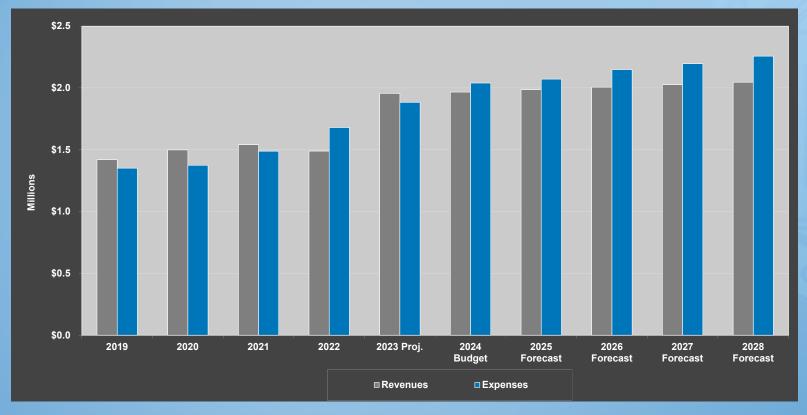
## BENHAM'S GROVE REVENUE AND EXPENSES







# WASTE COLLECTION FUND REVENUE AND EXPENSES

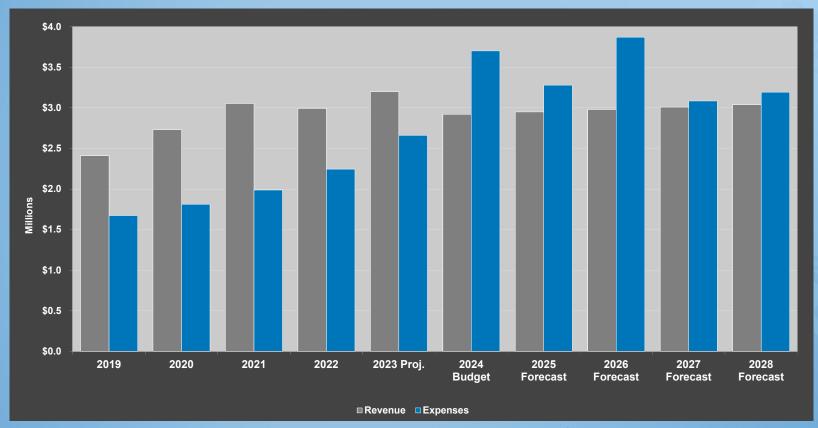

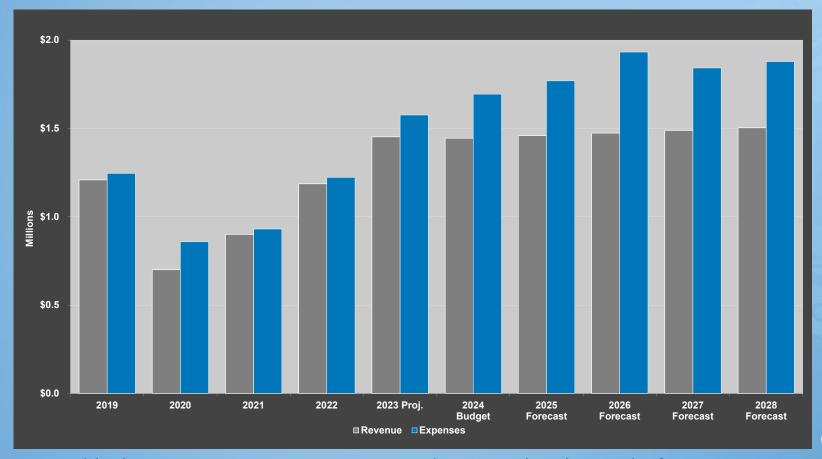
### YANKEE TRACE GOLF OPERATIONS

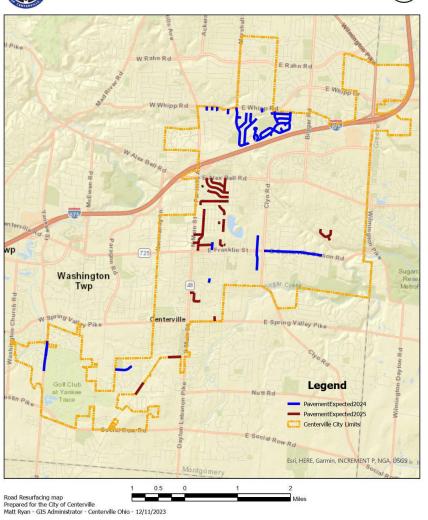
