- A. Eagle Scout, Owen Russell Deputy Mayor Kenley presented a Certificate of Congratulations to Eagle Scout Owen Russell. Mr. Russell introduced himself and spoke about his background in Scouting, his future plans, and his Eagle Scout project.
- B. Centerville-Washington History, Cheryl Meyer Deputy Mayor Kenley presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Cheryl Meyer recognizing her on her retirement and for her years of service as Director of the Centerville-Washington History. Mrs. Meyer introduced her family and friends and then spoke about her appreciation of the relationships built over the years.

Officials' Reports

Mr. Engert praised the Invocation led by Mr. Serr.

Mr. Engert thanked and acknowledged Cheryl Meyer.

Mr. Engert advised about the next Centerville-Washington Speaker Series session, featuring Ed Ross presenting Ida Weller - A Woman Ahead of Her Time reception at 6:30 p.m. presentation at 7:00 p.m. on February 20 at RecPlex West.

Mr. Palcher announced the Finance Committee will meet tomorrow Wednesday, February 20, 2024 at 3:30 p.m.

Mrs. Kenley spoke about her participation in the PUCO Nominating Committee interviews for the position of PUCO commissioner. Four candidates were recommended to the Governor and Jennifer French was selected to fill the seat again.

Mrs. Kenley stated positions with the PUCO are well paid with broad qualifications and encouraged the public to apply when opportunities arise.

Mrs. Kenley provided opponent testimony before the Pensions Committee in the Ohio House of Representatives regarding HB 296, which proposes to increase contribution amounts that employers of full-time municipal police officers must make to the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund. Her recommendation was for a committee to be appointed to conduct an audit of the pension plan to see if there is truly a need for the increased contributions.

In the City Manager's Report, Mr. Davis spoke about:

Old Business

A. PUBLIC HEARING: Ordinance 01-24, An Ordinance Providing For The Issuance Of Not To Exceed \$7,600,000 Park Improvement Bond Anticipation Notes (Benham Grove Project), By The City Of Centerville, Ohio, In Anticipation Of The Issuance Of Bonds Of The City.

Mr. Roark explained the Benham's Grove improvement project was one of the capital projects identified for debt financing. Mr. Roark discussed the specifics of the note, which is a limited tax general obligation bond anticipation note with a 12-month term. He discussed interest rates and options available at the maturity of the note. The financing team consists of Bradley Payne Advisors, Dinsmore and Shohl, and Fifth Third Securities.

Deputy Mayor Kenley opened the Public Hearing. Seeing no one come forward, Deputy Mayor Kenley closed the Public Hearing.

Mr. Serr sponsored Ordinance 01-24 and moved for its adoption. Mr. Engert seconded the motion, and it passed with 6 ayes.

B. PUBLIC HEARING: Ordinance 02-24, An Ordinance To Repeal Ordinance Numbers 23-93, 7-03, 24-11, 31-14, And 05-19 In Their Entirety And Establishing Fees And Charges For The Rental Of Facilities At Benham's Grove.

Mr. Bishop shared rates are being set for the new Event Center at Benham's Grove based on competitor pricing and rates for the historic campus will remain the same for 2025. He reviewed the proposed rates. Rates will be re-evaluated for 2026.

Mr. Engert inquired where the City's rates fall in comparison to other facilities in this area.

Mr. Bishop answered that these rates fall in the middle of comparable venues.

Deputy Mayor Kenley opened the Public Hearing. Seeing no one come forward, Deputy Mayor Kenley closed the Public Hearing.

Mr. Serr sponsored Ordinance 02-24 and moved for its adoption. Mr. Palcher seconded the motion, and it passed with 6 ayes.

 - Mr. Palcher sponsored Ordinance 06-24 and moved for its adoption. Mr. Serr seconded the motion and it passed with 6 ayes.
